VE Testing Opportunities

Do you have a Technician license and are interested in upgrading to General?

Are you a General wishing to pick up your Extra license? Opportunities are here in Lancaster for you to test!

The Red Rose Repeater Association sponsors a Laurel VEC associated VE team offering ham radio tests. Testing is held in the conference room where we hold our monthly meetings at the Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology, 750 E. King Street, Lancaster.

Registration begins at 10:00 am, with testing starting promptly at 10:30 am. Pre-registration is preferred, but walk-ins are welcome.

You must have a FRN (FCC Registration Number) for testing. A government issued ID is also required.

Upcoming test dates are July 16, September 17, November 19.

We will also be holding a test at the W3RRR Hamfest on Saturday October 1st in New Holland.

Recent changes to FCC rules with new Hams receiving a license require a \$35 fee for NEW HAMS obtaining a license. Existing HAMS upgrading can upgrade for free. The fee is collected by the FCC.

FCC FEE UDATE

The recent changes to the FCC rules regarding fees have been popping up in many conversations between HAMS lately. Here is a simple down and dirty explanation of the changes and what you can expect.

If you obtain your license as a new HAM (never licensed before), you will have to pay a \$35 fee. If you walk into a test site as a non-licensed civilian and you pass one, two or all three licenses in one sitting, you will pay only one \$35 fee. If you apply for and get a vanity call sign, there is a \$35 fee for that.

If you already have a license and you upgrade from one license to the next, there is NO fee. Upgrades from Technician to General, General to Extra, or Technician to Extra are free. NO fee for upgrades.

The fee is paid to the FCC. You will receive an email from the FCC with a link to pay the fee if you are getting your license for the first time. Your license will not be issued until you pay.
